## The Word of God

Linda

Written near the end of the first century the book of Acts, penned by the same person who composed the gospel of Luke, tells the story of the expansion of the Church. This episode that the writer relates is set in the days immediately following Pentecost. The scene is this: Peter and John in Jesus name have healed a lame man at the Jerusalem Temple gate. The astonished crowd that has witnessed the healing is told the story of Jesus' death and resurrection. This has angered the Temple authorities and they move to silence the apostle's testimony. As you will hear in this first reading from Acts, chapter 4, those who were empowered at Pentecost by the Spirit will not, cannot remain silent.

The rulers, elders, and scribes assembled in Jerusalem, with Annas the high priest, Caiaphas, John, and Alexander, and all who were of the high-priestly family. When they had made the prisoners stand in their midst, they inquired, "By what power or by what name did you do this?"

Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them, "Rulers of the people and elders, if we are questioned today because of a good deed done to someone who was sick and are asked how this man has been healed, let it be known to all of you, and to all the people of Israel, that this man is standing before you in good health by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead. This Jesus is 'the stone that was rejected by you, the builders; it has become the cornerstone.' There is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among mortals by which we must be saved."

Near the end of the first century an unknown author wrote three brief letters, the first being the longest. The community that the writer addresses has recently experienced conflict and division and this has resulted a breakup within the community. A clue to what has happened is given at the beginning of this reading: it seems that some affluent members in the community have denied helping others less fortunate than themselves. They have refused to reach out to them and give assistance to "the poorer ones". The author reminds the congregation that love, if it is to be real and effective should lead to acts of charity, otherwise it's just empty words that lack substance. A reading from the 1<sup>st</sup> letter of John, chapter 3 verses 16-24

We know love by this, that he laid down his life for us - and we ought to lay down our lives for one another. How does God's love abide in anyone who has the world's goods and sees a brother or sister in need and yet refuses help? Little children, let us love, not in word or speech, but in truth and action. And by this we will know that we are from the truth and will reassure our hearts before him whenever our hearts condemn us; for God is greater than our hearts, and he knows everything.

Beloved, if our hearts do not condemn us, we have boldness before God; and we receive from him whatever we ask, because we obey his commandments and do what pleases him. And this is his commandment, that we should believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and love one another, just as he has commanded us. All who obey his commandments abide in him, and he abides in them. And by this we know that he abides in us, by the Spirit that he has given us.
